
US TRAVELLERS' CONFIDENCE MIGHT START IMPROVING, BUT OVERSEAS TRIPS TO EUROPE ARE

IOT THE PREFERRED OPTION JUST YET

Evolution of intention to travel long-haul and to Europe in the US


Index Base:100 (>100=expansion, <100=decline)



The sentiment index for overseas travel among Americans is positive, however worryingly, only 2 in 5 of those surveyed are optimistic about visiting Europe in summer 2021. This is a warning sign for the European tourism industry and may lead to the region losing out to domestic and regional destinations (which are more easily accessible e.g. Mexico and the Caribbean for the US) if no travel mechanisms are implemented and working in the next weeks/month

(% of respondents)




Larger shares of Americans who were pessimistic about overseas travel in summer 2021 shared that they either had COVID-19 related concerns (37%) or did not feel ready to go on a long-haul trip (38%). Meanwhile, the travel-related costs somewhat grew as a concern preventing Americans from organising summer trips far from home.


^{*} Values above 100 indicate a positive evolution, whereas values below 100 indicate negative attitudes towards travel in a given time period


Preferred type of destination to visit
